

## Paramus Recycling Center Hours

### (Proof of Residency Required)

Garbage or debris is **NOT** to be dumped anywhere in the DPW complex. Anyone caught doing so will be subject to illegal dumping fines of \$1,000.00!

**24 hour drop off** – Containers are located outside the recycling gate to accommodate after hour drop off of newspapers, cardboard and commingled materials.

**Items accepted at the Recycling Center:** Cardboard, clothes (clean/useable), commingled materials (bottles, cans, plastic containers), computers, electronics, metal, newspapers, used motor oil and tires. There is a surcharge of \$2 off rim or \$3 on rim for each tire disposed of at the recycling center to be paid at time of drop off.

# Paramus Commingled Recycling – What Is and Isn't Acceptable

## ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:

- Aluminum Food and Beverage Containers:



Aluminum soda and beer cans, pet food cans, etc.

Clean aluminum foil and pie plates

- Glass Food and Beverage Containers:

Clear, brown, green glass



- Ferrous Cans:

Bimetal/Tin/Steel soup, food, coffee cans

- P.E.T.E. Plastic Containers with Symbol #1



Plastic water, soda or beverage bottles of various colors

- H.D.P.E. Natural Plastic Containers with Symbol #2



Milk jug and water jug containers only (narrow neck containers)



- H.D.P.E. Pigmented Plastic Containers with Symbol #2



Household detergent, shampoo, bleach bottles, etc. (narrow neck containers)



- PP Polypropylene Containers with Symbol #5



Found in some yogurt, butter, margarine containers, syrup and ketchup bottles

**\*\*\*All acceptable material should be rinsed clean and free of any debris or residue\*\*\***

## MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

### Plastic Bags of any size or color

Hazardous waste, medical waste, syringes, e-waste, PVC pipe, rechargeable batteries, propane tanks, mirrors, window or auto glass, light bulbs, ceramics, microwave trays, Styrofoam, straws, fast food trays, and **any plastic containers with the numbers 3, 4, 6, or 7 on them or no number at all**, oil, chemical or antifreeze containers, aerosol cans, pesticide containers, brown bags, any paper products, coat hangers, paint cans, plastic film, 55 gallon drums, tar pails, flower pots, laundry baskets, vacuum hoses, plumbing accessories, toys, building products, wood, wire of any kind, electrical equipment, dishes, cooking trays, pots, pans, toasters, general household items, coolers, old VCR/cassette tapes, vinyl siding, wheels, pool liners, hoses and covers, shower curtains, plastic fencing, rubber hoses, bowling balls, tool boxes, fiberglass, fabrics/clothing, etc. etc....

# Plastic Bag Ban

## Ordinance #19-16



**When:** Starting January 1, 2020, the Borough of Paramus will ban plastic bags that are provided to customers at point of sale.

**Who:** All retail establishments and food vendors. Retailers include grocery stores, restaurants, corner stores, clothing stores, liquor stores and every other retailer that provided plastic bags to customers at point of sale.

### Which bags will be allowed?

Paper Bags	Reusable Bags
Recyclable paper carry-out bag/ compliant bag, as defined by the ordinance, and "reusable bags".	Any sewn bag made of cloth or other washable fabric with stitched handles that are specifically manufactured for multiple reuse.
Recyclable paper carry out bags meet <u>one</u> of the following requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 100% recyclable and contains a minimum of 40% post consumer recycled material.</li> <li>• Can be composted.</li> <li>• Displays the words "recyclable" and/or "reusable" in highly visible manner on the outside of bag.</li> </ul>	Reusable bags meet the following requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Machine washable or made from material that can be cleaned or disinfected.</li> <li>• Does not contain lead, cadmium, or any other heavy metal in toxic amounts, as defined by applicable state and federal standards and regulations.</li> <li>• Is affixed with a statement that the bag is reusable, as well as recycling instructions if recyclable.</li> </ul>

The ban does **not** apply to the following bags: packaged bulk items, contained or wrapped frozen foods, meat or fish, whether packaged or not; contained or wrapped flowers, potted plants or other items where dampness may be an issue; contain unwrapped prepared foods or bakery items; pharmacy bags to contain prescription drugs; newspaper bags; dry cleaning bags; garbage, pet waste or yard waste bags; bags provided by food trucks.



# Paramus Polystyrene Foam Ban

## Ordinance #19-16



**When:** Starting January 1, 2020, the Borough of Paramus will ban #6 Expanded polystyrene foam.

**Who:** All food service facilities including: food establishments, coffee shops, convenience stores, hospital cafeterias, school cafeterias, supermarkets and grocery stores, food carts or trucks and discount/dollar stores.

### Why is polystyrene bad?

Health (high dose exposure - industrial)	Environmental
<b>Neurotoxic</b>	<b>Difficult to recycle</b>

Nephrotoxic Lymph toxins	

Items **not** permitted: disposable food ware (cups, plates, bowls, trays, clamshell containers, take-away containers, packing peanuts.

With Recycle Coach, residents can:


- Stay organized with custom curbside collection and events calendars

# General Information to all Paramus Residents:

## General Notice:

Residents are **not** permitted to place garbage, trash or grass waste at the curb before **6:00 PM** on the day prior to scheduled collection, nor later than **5:00 AM** on the scheduled collection day.

## Snowfall Notice:

In the event of a snowfall of **3 inches** or more during any weekday, the scheduled garbage and recycling pick up for that day **may** be suspended. Garbage would then be picked up on your next regular scheduled day. Recycling pick up would be **cancelled** and **NOT** rescheduled.

## Leaf Pick Up Notice:

- During the period of **October 1st** to **December 6th** grass and leaves may be put into the curb-line, loose and **un-bagged**, for pick up by our leaf machines.
- **Do NOT mix branches, sticks or twigs in with leaves!**
- **NO resident or landscaper may place leaves in the street after December 6th.**
- On December 7th, please follow rules for grass pickup.
- FYI: Residents may continue to put leaves and grass in garbage pails or biodegradable paper bags, which will be collected every Wednesday.

# General Information to all Paramus Residents (continued):

## Building Material Notice:

All materials from construction, renovation or demolition, including but not limited to:

- Sheetrock
- Shingles
- Cabinets
- Formica
- Wood
- Etc.

Are **NOT** considered garbage, trash or refuse and **WILL NOT** be collected by the Borough of Paramus. Any type of wood (including fencing) will **NOT** be picked up. The disposal and cost of dumping these materials are the sole responsibility of the contractor or the resident. Contractors hired by residents are responsible for removing their debris.

## DPW Complex Notice:

Garbage or debris is **NOT** to be dumped anywhere in the DPW Complex. Anyone caught doing so will be subject to illegal dumping fines of **\$1,000.00!**

# What is What?

**Recycling Container:** May contain the following materials: aluminum, tin and metal cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic beverage containers, soda, laundry detergent and bleach bottles.

**NOTE:** All of the above **MUST** be emptied and washed to remove beverage or food waste.

**NO** Styrofoam of any kind in any form.

Containers found with unacceptable material will **NOT** be emptied.

**PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT TO BE PUT INTO RECYCLING CONTAINERS.**

**Brush and Branches:** These items will be picked up the same day as your Recycling Container (OTTO).

**Brush:** Trimmings from trees and shrubs (small twigs).

**Branches:** Should be cut into four (4) foot lengths and no larger than eight (8) inches in diameter.

**NOTE:** Both Brush and Branches may be tied into manageable bundles and/or put into open containers or brown bio-degradable bags.

**Leaves and Grass Clippings:** Leaves and grass clippings that are contained in either bio-degradable bags or open containers weighing no more than 40 lbs. are picked up at the curb on Wednesdays throughout the year except for holidays.

**NOTE:** There cannot be any dirt, rocks, twigs, and/or branches mixed with leaves and grass clippings.

**Christmas Trees:** Will be picked up on Wednesdays as well as your scheduled brush collection day.

**Newspapers:** Must be tied securely or placed in paper bags only. **DO NOT PLACE INTO PLASTIC BAGS OR PAILS.** Newspapers do not go into the recycling (OTTO) container. Magazines, soft cover books and junk mail may be put out with newspapers.

## What is What? (continued)

**Cardboard:** Must be collapsed and tied and placed at the curb the same day as **newspapers**. Cardboard and newspapers must be secured to keep them from being blown away by strong winds.

**White Goods:** Boilers, washers, dryers, hot water heaters, stoves, refrigerators and all aluminum and metal will be picked up by **appointment only** at no charge.

**NOTE:** Refrigerators must have doors removed.

**TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT:** Call 201-265-2100 ext. #3100 **PRIOR** to putting items out at the curb.

**Computers, Electronics and TVs:** Must either be brought to the recycling center or may be scheduled for collection by **appointment only**.

**NOTE:** Trash containers will **NOT** be emptied if they contain any recyclable items.

**TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT:** Call 201-265-2100 ext. #3100 **PRIOR** to putting items out at the curb.

**Firewood Information:** Free firewood is available to residents of Paramus (proof of residency required) at the recycling center. Firewood can be obtained on a first come first serve basis and as supply is available. There is a 40 piece limit.

**To Report a Pot Hole:** Log on to the Borough of Paramus website [www.paramusborough.org](http://www.paramusborough.org) choose "Report a Concern" on the right side, then under Public Works click pothole. Click "Submit New Problem", fill in all requested information, click "submit" button.

\*A Username and password will have to be created.

**NOTE:** Potholes reported on county roads or state highways will be forwarded to the proper agency responsible for maintenance. Paramus has no control over roadways not maintained by the Borough.




